

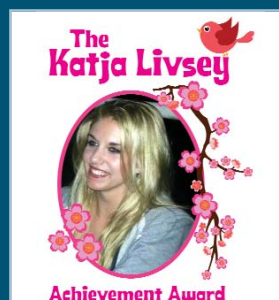
KATJA LIVSEY ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Katja Hansen, also known as Katja Livsey, had just been accepted into the University of Liverpool School of Medicine when she was killed in a road accident on 16 November 2013. She was 19 and has left an enormous empty space in the heart of everyone who knew her.

In memory of Katja a range of events from a cake sale to a 20 mile cycle ride have taken place. Money raised is being used to create a bird sculpture in the Liverpool Medical School's admissions building together with a bursary scheme at Reepham College called The Katja Livsey Achievement Award.

Katja was an outstanding student who worked hard to achieve her dream of studying medicine; she had great perception and an incredible appreciation of how small gestures can make a big difference.

Year 13 students will be able to apply to The Katja Livsey Achievement Award from September 2014 for financial support for items such as equipment, travel to university open days or specific events to support students with university applications.
