

In 1996 we heard of the opportunity to join schools in Leer (De), Dornbirn (A) and Sélestat (F) in a joint curriculum partnership. Funded by the Comenius scheme of the British Council, we have been able to maintain this partnership until the present day. The schools have changed and developed, our ideas widened and our plans have become more ambitious. Since finding our first international friends in these three countries we have gone on to develop partnerships with many other schools in many different countries but we are especially proud of the professional and personal friendships that have endured the test of time.
